Steel aerosol cans such as hair spray, bug spray, or spray paint

These may contain hazardous waste. DO NOT dispose of partially full cans with regular garbage! Never burn aerosol cans, even if they are empty since they may explode. EMPTY hazardous aerosol cans are safe to dispose of in the trash. Other household EMPTY non-hazardous aerosol cans such as hairspray, cooking spray and air freshener spray can be put in your curbside recycle bin.

- 1. Use it up. As noted above, you can safely *throw away* an EMPTY aerosol can that contained hazardous material. You can *recycle* an EMPTY aerosol can that contained household products in your **blue bin at curbside**.
- 2. Drop it off. If a hazardous or non-hazardous aerosol can contains product you can take it (free for residents) to be recycled at the Household Hazardous Waste Collection Center at 5125 NE 63rd Avenue, 334-0440 or any of the Alachua County Rural Collection Centers at no charge (always call for details). They are open Monday, Tuesday, Friday & Saturday from 7:30 am to 5:30 pm:

3. Businesses (conditionally exempt small quantity generators) can drop off aerosol cans at the **Household Hazardous Waste Collection Center** (fee charged). Large businesses with larger quantities can contact a chemical waste disposal firm directly.

Aluminum Cans

Clean, empty aluminum cans

1. **Recycle** at **curbside** or drop off at **SP Recycling, 5121 NE 63rd Ave., 378-3001** or any of the **Alachua County Rural Collection Centers** at no charge (always call for details). They are open Monday, Tuesday, Friday & Saturday from 7:30 am to 5:30 pm:

3. **Businesses** should ask their contracted garbage hauler to provide recycling containers. There is a mandatory commercial recycling ordinance (Sec. 27-85) for the City of Gainesville. Businesses can also sell their aluminum to the above companies to help raise money for charities, Christmas parties, etc.

Animals, dead

Domestic or wild

NOTE: Do NOT dispose of dead animals in the regular garbage or in a commercial dumpster! Use caution in handling or transporting a dead animal. Wear protective clothing including gloves and place animal into a heavy-duty garbage bag.

To report a dead animal on the road or public right-of-way:

- 1. State road Call the **Dept. of Transportation** at 381-4300
- 2. County road Call **Road and Bridges** at 374-5245 ext. 215
- 3. City road Call **Solid Waste Division** at 334-2330

Report injured bear, panther or eagle (endangered species only) to: Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission's Wildlife Alert at 1-888-404-3922.

Dead domestic & wild animals on private property:

- 1. Bury the animal (at least 3 feet underground)
- 2. Call Critter Control at 372-3922 (fee charged)
- 3. Cremation for beloved domestic animals from 1 to 120 lbs (call for fee ranges) at **Alachua Co. Animal Services at 264-6870**.

Antifreeze

Ethylene glycol coolant used in vehicle radiators

This is hazardous waste. Do NOT dispose with regular garbage!

Never leave a puddle of antifreeze on the driveway or leave a bucket of antifreeze unattended. It can be fatal to children or pets.

1. **Drop off** (free to residents) at the **Household Hazardous Waste Collection Center**, **5125 NE 63rd Avenue**, **334-0440** for recycling or any of the **Alachua County Rural Collection Centers** at no charge (always call for details). They are open Monday, Tuesday, Friday & Saturday from 7:30 am to 5:30 pm:

2. **Businesses** (conditionally exempt small quantity generators) can also drop off antifreeze (for a fee) at the **Household Hazardous Waste Collection Center.**

Appliances

Electric or gas-powered device such as stove, refrigerator, air conditioner, Washer, dryer, dishwasher, freezer, water heater, etc. (also called "white goods")

- 1. **Donate** to the retailer. Ask them to haul away your old appliance when they deliver the new one. This is the simplest method of recycling appliances.
- 2. **Donate** working appliances that are in good condition to a person or non-profit organization (always call first for specifics):

- 3. **Donate** through <u>www.freecycle.org</u>. This is a free website for people or organizations to give away (recycle) unwanted items. Sign up for the local Gainesville group.
- 4. **Sell** working appliances through the newspaper, yard sale, or a secondhand dealer. The following businesses will buy scrap metal (call for details & specifics):

- 5. **Dispose.** Please do not cut or damage the lines in the back of units containing refrigerants (such as refrigerators, freezers, air conditioners, etc.) to prevent release of harmful chemicals. Always tape or rope doors shut or better still, take the doors off the appliance when placing at the curb to insure the safety of small children and pets.
- 6. City of Gainesville residents with curbside service can call the **Solid Waste Division** at **334-2330** for a whitegoods pickup (no charge). White goods (appliances) are picked up only on Wednesday inside the City limits so call at least 24 hours in advance to insure getting scheduled, otherwise you will have to wait until the following Wednesday.
- 7. Alachua County residents with curbside service can call **Alachua County Waste Collection at 338-3233** for pickup and specifics.
- 8. All residents of Alachua County can take their appliances to the select Alachua County Rural Collection Centers. They are open on Monday-Tuesday-Friday-Saturday from 7:30 am to 5:30 pm. The ones that take appliances are:
 - A. Phifer 334-2874
 - B. Archer 495-3257
- 9. <u>Businesses</u> (conditionally exempt small quantity generators) can sell or donate their *in good condition* appliances to the above locations or take their appliance to the **Environmental Park & Transfer Station**, **5125 NE 63rd Ave**, **334-0176** (Fee Charged) for disposal.

Asbestos

Fireproof items made of asbestos such as certain insulation, shingles, siding, or linoleum

Batteries – alkaline

Single- use household batteries (Not rechargeable)

NOTE: Alkaline batteries are **safe to dispose** in the regular trash. However, it's better to recycle them if possible, and/or replace them with rechargeable batteries.

Batteries – button cell

Small round batteries (resembling a coin) found in items Such as hearing aids, calculators, cameras, laser pointers, and watches

These are hazardous waste. Do NOT dispose with regular trash!

- 1. **Drop off** at the **Household Hazardous Waste Collection Center**, 5125 NE 63rd Ave, 334-0440 or call for drop off locations (free for residents).
- 2. **Check with** your local jewelry, camera or watch repair store, which may accept button cell batteries.
- 3. **Businesses** (conditionally exempt small quantity generators) can drop off batteries at the **Household Hazardous Waste Collection Center** (for a fee). Call for information.

Batteries - rechargeable

Nickel cadmium (Ni-Cd), nickel hydride (NI- MH), lithium ion (Li-ion) And small sealed lead (Pb) batteries found in cordless items such as laptop computers, power tools, toys, cameras, radios, and phones

These are hazardous waste. Do NOT dispose with regular trash!

1. **Drop off** at the **Household Hazardous Waste Collection Center, 5125 NE 63rd Ave, 334-0440** or any of the **Alachua County Rural Collection Centers** at no charge (always call for details). They are open Monday, Tuesday, Friday & Saturday from 7:30 am to 5:30 pm:

3. **Businesses** (conditionally exempt small quantity generators) can drop off batteries (for a fee) at the **Household Hazardous Waste Collection Center.** For large amounts of rechargeable batteries try **Metal Conversion Technologies, LLC**, 678 721-0022, www.metalconversion.com. There is a cost.

Batteries – Vehicle

Lead acid batteries found in vehicles including cars, trucks, motorcycles, boats, scooters, Wheelchairs, golf carts, riding lawnmowers, and children's riding toys

These are hazardous waste. Do NOT dispose with regular trash!

- 1. **Recycle** at an automotive parts retailer (such as **Sears, Wal-Mart, Auto Zone, NAPA, Discount Auto Parts, CARQUEST, Pep Boys, etc.). You save money by turning in your old battery when you buy a new one. This is a state "core charge" to discourage people from trashing vehicle batteries. NOTE:** You pay this fee only if you don't turn in your old battery.
- 2. Drop off at Interstate Battery, 2421 NW 71st Pl, 372-0133. No Charge
- 3. **Gulf Coast Metals, 817 NE Waldo Rd, 373-6354** will pay you a small amount of money, depending on the type of vehicle battery.
- 4. **Drop off** at the **Household Hazardous Waste Collection Center, 5125 NE 63rd Ave, 334-0440** or any of the **Alachua County Rural Collection Centers** at no charge (always call for details). They are open Monday, Tuesday, Friday & Saturday from 7:30 am to 5:30 pm:

Bulk Items

Bulk Items

Large items that don't fit into the curbside garbage cart Such as carpet, vacuum, mop, lamp or furniture

All City of Gainesville and Alachua County residents with curbside service no longer have to schedule for a bulk pickup, but they still have to call and schedule their "White Goods" (large appliances) to be picked up.

City of Gainesville residents can put their legal bulk items out before 7 am on their regular garbage day. Smaller items that can fit will go with the garbage and larger items will be put on a list for another truck to come by to get later. Check with customer service, 334-2330 if you are unsure of a bulk item you wish to put at the curb.

Clean, empty, flattened corrugated cardboard boxes (TIP: corrugated cardboard has three layers including a wavy middle layer)

Flares & Flare Guns, marine, automotive

Signaling devices used on boats and automobiles

These are hazardous waste. Do NOT dispose with regular trash!

It is <u>illegal</u> to throw used flares in household or business trash and under no circumstances should they be dropped overboard or buried.

1. **Keep!**

- a) According to the US Coast Guard, marine flares are good for as long as 20 years, if the flares are in good shape (no rips).
- b) Keep expired flares that are still dry in a plastic bag, and store onboard to use as backup for emergencies. Use your expired flares first & if they don't work then there is no loss. If they do work then you have your newer flares for later use.
- c) Always keep expired flares separate from new flares.



To dry paint: Use an open, secure, sheltered area – away from flames, children or pets. You can leave the can open, or pour the paint into a box of crumbled newspaper. Kitty litter also works well to help dry out empty paint cans.

2. Absorbents used for **motor oil** are hazardous and must be disposed of properly.

See - Motor Oil

3. Absorbents used for **cooking oil** (such as paper towels) are not hazardous and can be disposed in the regular trash, just as cooking oil can be,

Oil Paint

Oil-based alkyd, polyurethane, or varnish paint in a spray or can

This is hazardous waste. Do NOT dispose with regular trash,
Pour down the drain, or on the ground! EMPTY dry cans are safe to dispose in the trash.

NOTE: Please do not throw away cans with ANY oil paint inside (even if it's dry). Instead, use it up, donate it, or drop it off for safe disposal.

- 1. **Reduce** waste by buying only as much paint as you need.
- 2. **Use** leftover paint by:
 - a) Painting a closet, garage, basement, attic, or some other out-of-the-way place.
 - b) Painting a primer coat (which will be covered with a final coat).
 - c) Mixing paints with similar colors (oil only).

The categories of plastic that can be recycled are bottles, jugs, jars & tubs #1-7. Understand that all categories of plastics with a number are **NOT** recyclable in Alachua County, just in the categories of bottles, jugs, jars & tubs.

Examples of plastic containers that can be recycled (up to 2-gallon size) are:

Bottles: juice, water, soda, cooking oil, hair, body, etc.

Jugs: milk, juice, laundry, kitty litter, etc.

Jars: peanut butter, jelly, mayonnaise, fruit, etc. Tubs: yogurt, cottage cheese, sour cream, butter, etc.

MEDUIM TANKS (2-20 lbs). Such as a gas grill or turkey fryer tank:

- 1. **Reuse** tank by refilling it. Tank must have an OPD (overfilling protection device) valve. If the tank's hand wheel is triangular-shaped, it can be refilled; if it is round or star-shaped, then it cannot be refilled.

Smoke Detectors

Battery-operated or electrical device used to warn occupants of smoke

These are hazardous waste. Do NOT dispose with regular trash! Never break open a smoke detector!

- 1. **Return** an old or defective smoke detector to the manufacturer:
 - a) Manufactures are required by law to accept detectors for disposal as hazardous waste. Most smoke detectors are hazardous due to small amount of radioactive material (Americium 241) inside. The material is not harmful unless the device is opened; so do not take a smoke detector apart.
 - b) Look for manufacturer information on bottom or inside if detector, or in the instruction/warranty materials.
 - c) If you can't find and address or phone number on you detector, look for the brand name (the most common are listed below). Call for instructions on mailing it back:

Syringes, needles, sharps, or lancets used for injecting medicine

These are hazardous waste. Do NOT dispose with regular trash!

1. Syringes, needles, lancets, or "sharps" are considered hazardous **biomedical** waste. These items must be handled by an approved biomedical waste treatment facility, or through the **Sharps Disposal Program**. Visit one of the exchange sites listed below during the hours given and ask for an approved sharps container. A charge of \$3.00 for each container is required to offset the cost of the container and its safe disposal.



- 2. **Businesses** (conditionally exempt small quantity generators) may also take (for a fee) tar to the **Household Hazardous Waste Collection Center** or another option is to contact a chemical waste disposal firm directly.

Thermometer / Thermostat

Temperature gauge containing mercury

These are hazardous waste. Do NOT dispose with regular trash!

NOTE: Thermometers or thermostats that do NOT contain mercury are not hazardous and may be disposed in the regular trash.

- 1. **Cleanup** for a broken thermometer or thermostat (that contains mercury), avoid touching the mercury. Sweep onto a newspaper, and put it in a plastic bag. If the item is on carpet, use a vacuum to clean it up, and put the vacuum bag into a plastic bag. Dispose of the bagged mercury properly (see #2 and 3 below)
- 2. Drop Off at the Household Hazardous Waste Collection Center, 5125 NE 63rd Ave, 334-0440.
- 3. **Business** can drop off items (for a fee) at the above Collection Center. Another option is to contact a chemical waste disposal firm directly.

Tires

Tires from an automobile, boat trailer, motorcycle, etc.

- 1. **Reduce** tire wear (and prolog the life of your tires) with regular inflation, balancing and rotation.
- 2. **Repair or reuse** a tire with patching or re-treading.
- 3. Dispose for a fee at the Environmental Park & Transfer Station, 5125 NE 63rd Ave., 334-0176.
- 4. The **Tire Roundup** occurs once per year for the purpose of helping Alachua County residents get rid of unwanted tires. Residents can contact **Alachua County Waste Management**, **374-5213** for the next scheduled roundup.

Toys

Dolls, games, cars, blocks, stuffed animals, swings, playhouse, etc.

NOTE: If you dispose toys in the trash, please remove rechargeable batteries first!

Yard Waste

Leaves, tree branches, grass clippings, plants, etc.

NOTE: Curbside pick up regulations are: Branches can be no larger than 5 feet in length or 6 inches in diameter. All leaves and small loose twigs must be containerized in **brown paper lawn and leaf bags or reusable trash cans**. No single item should be heavier than 40 lbs. If you are in the City of Gainesville limits yard trash with the above requirements is unlimited. The County has a 10 bag (container) limit per week.

- 1. **Reuse** for mulch or compost. Instead of bagging yard waste:
 - a) Leave grass clipping on your lawn
 - b) Use fallen leaves to mulch plant beds.
 - c) Compost your grass, leaves, plants, etc.
